We are always looking for more people of all ages to join our enthusiastic team of volunteers. Could this be you?




WHY VOLUNTEER?

OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE

Whether you have lots of time on your hands, or just a spare hour here or there, we can find something to suit you. Here's a summary of some of the opportunities available for all ages...

Hospital Befriending



Volunteers visit elderly patients who have no other visitors, or whose family or carers need a break. They work on a rota basis, chatting, listening and providing general stimulation.

Befriending at Home



Volunteers visit isolated older people in their own homes.
These include people who have recently been discharged from hospital to ensure that they have settled back in at home, are supporting themselves and are

not isolated. A person is visited for up to six weeks during which time they are supported and encouraged to reconnect with their local community.

Telephone Befriending

Volunteers keep in touch with older people by phone, to share important information which may include giving details of flu vaccinations, changes to services or simply checking that they are safe and well.

Agewell Shops

Volunteers help to run our retail outlets.
They receive and sort stock, serve customers, and ensure the retail space is kept tidy.
At Sandwell Hospital they also undertake a trolley-round to all wards.

Providing Administration Support

Volunteers help with some of the administration tasks that are so necessary to the maintenance and progress of our work. General office work may include filing, photocopying, answering telephones and data entry. Previous office experience and computer literacy is useful.

- escorting older people to hospital and GP appointments
- helping with specific consultations and campaigns for issues which affect older people including our annual Winter Flu campaign
